The task force is looking to provide a more in depth report after a few more of their meetings. The Task Force is looking to share more information with the successes that the Township has had with SD U-46. In response to research and a report on Quality of Life. A portion of the survey looked at Education, graduation rates, attendance and other areas like health insurance and other needs as well as services. One glaring gap was the educational attainment area. COY had conversations about this and the impact that Hanover Township can have and so the Township approved a task force to take shape around this and other items.
