All firms shall include with their statement of qualifications all required information and materials, as set forth in the documents listed above.

The Mental Health Board will evaluate firms based on the information and materials contained in their respective statements of qualifications. The Mental Health Board may conduct interviews with and/or require public presentations by firms deemed to be qualified. The firm selected by the Mental Health Board will be required to execute a professional services agreement with the Mental Health Board. No changes will be allowed in the professional services agreement, unless otherwise agreed upon by the Mental Health Board in writing.

The Mental Health Board reserves the right to accept any statement of qualifications in its entirety or part thereof, or reject any statement of qualifications in its entirety or part thereof, and to waive minor irregularities and nonconformities in any statement of qualification. The Mental Health Board, further, reserves the right to reject any firm if, in the judgment of the Mental Health Board, such firm is not qualified to provide services in connection with the Project.
