Tax Aide for 2024 Tax Returns

Mondays & Wednesdays

February 5 – April 7

By appointment only

Hanover Township Aging Services will begin taking appointments for A.A.R.P.'s free Tax Aide program on **Tuesday, January 21, 2025, at 9:00 A.M.** This program is staffed by volunteers trained by A.A.R.P. who will be available to complete basic tax returns. The Township has no control over the manner in which the AARP volunteers prepare the tax returns nor does the Township review any tax returns to verify whether they have been properly prepared and/or contain any errors. Participants in this program will be asked to sign a Tax-Aide Waiver and Release recognizing certain risks of errors, omissions, and other mistakes in performing tax assistance and relinquishing all claims against Hanover Township. All tax returns will be filed electronically. Appointments will only be scheduled over the phone; please call **(630) 483-5660 to schedule an appointment.** Please note, appointments will be made on a first-come, first-served basis and filled in date order. Anyone who is filing tax returns at an AARP site will need to present their official Social Security card.

NEW! CAREGIVER RESOURCE CENTER

We are pleased to inform you that effective October 1, 2024, Aging Services has expanded the services offered to unpaid caregivers residing in Hanover Township. Katherine Ackley, Caregiver Resource Specialist, has joined the Social Services team and is providing the following services: information and assistance, case management, counseling, group education, respite, outreach, and facilitating the monthly Caregiver Support Group. For assistance or questions, Katherine's office is located in the lower level of the Senior Center and she can be reached at (630) 483-5660.

LIHEAP PROGRAM

The LIHEAP Program, Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, began October 1, 2024 for income-eligible residents to receive assistance with gas and/or electric bills. The program is available until August 15, 2025 or until funds are exhausted. Documentation required includes Social Security cards for any new applicants, 30-day income for everyone in the household, and most recent gas and electric bill.

BENEFITS SCREENINGS AND MEDICARE COUNSELING

Social Services staff can meet with individuals or caregivers to screen for available benefits, complete program applications, and provide information and referrals. All Social Services staff are trained Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) Counselors. We can assist you if you have questions about Medicare, health benefits, claims or grievances. Some of the programs we can help with include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, prescription assistance programs, utility savings, and more! VULNERABLE ADULT LIST

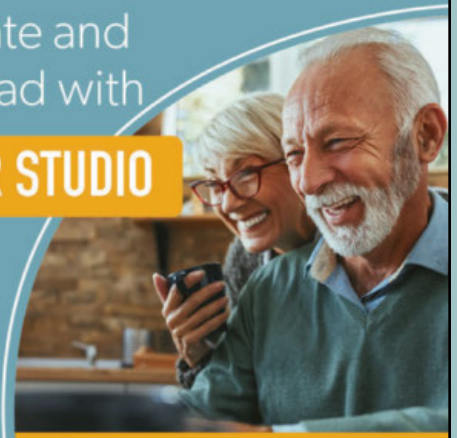

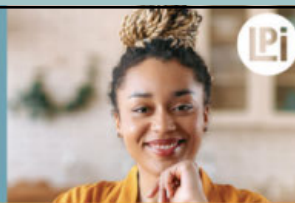

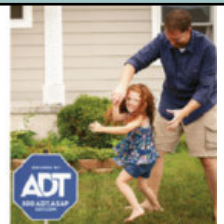
