#### Minutes of a Meeting of the

Hanover Township Board Held at 250 S. Route 59, Bartlett, IL 60103 April 17, 2012 \*\*DRAFT\*\*

#### I. Call to Order/Roll Call

Supervisor McGuire called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Clerk Dolan Baumer called the roll; present were Trustees Benoit, Burke and Krick, and Supervisor McGuire. Absent: Trustee Westlund-Deenihan.

Elected and appointed officials present: Assessor Thomas Smogolski, Highway Commissioner P. Craig Ochoa, Collector Frank Liquori.

Staff and others present Administrator James Barr, Emergency Services Director Dan Palmer, Facilities & Maintenance Director Steve Spejcher, Manager of Community Relations Thomas Kuttenberg, Senior Services Director Barb Kurth-Schuldt, Welfare Services Director Mary Jo Imperato, Youth & Family Services Director John Parquette, Management Analyst Becky Suhajda, Deputy Clerk Hope Duval, and Attorney Larry Mraz. The Senior Committee members and their Chair George Hough were present. Present were volunteers from the Food Pantry and Messers. Tadevich and Pruchnick, Mr. George Rosner, and students from Streamwood High School.

- II. Pledge of Allegiance: Supervisor McGuire asked everyone to stand and join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- III. Town Hall: Supervisor McGuire asked if there was anyone in the audience who had comments to make or questions to ask of the Board. There was no response.

#### IV. Presentations:

Supervisor McGuire asked that the Board join him in recognizing CPL Robert J. Tadevich Sr. on his being inducted into the Veterans Honor Roll.

Further, Mr. McGuire asked that the Board also recognize AT3 Daniel A. Pruchnick who served our country and is inducted into the Veterans Honor Roll at Hanover Township.

Supervisor McGuire recognized Mr. George Rosner who is retiring this year from his position as Civics teacher at Streamwood High School. Mr McGuire presented a plaque of appreciation to him and listed Mr. Rosner's accomplishments, key among them being the start up of Student Government Day where students take a hands-on approach to learning about government. Those gathered, including numerous senior high school students, gave him a rousing applause.

#### V. Reports:

- A. Supervisor's Report: Mr. McGuire noted that the Veterans Honor Roll Dinners were held last night and he thanked the Streamwood High School volunteers and the Township staff for their service to 225 people present. The veterans thanked Hanover Township for what is done for them. Mr. McGuire also thanked the Board for its support of the Supervisors Community Service Awards evening where over 200 people gathered for the event. Photos are on the website of all nominees. He attended the Village of Hoffman Estates/City of Elgin/Village of Hanover Park meeting regarding the Northwest Regional 4th of July Celebration event. The Commissioner Ochoa has also volunteered his staff in support of this event. National Dispatcher Awareness Week was last week and he proclaimed that week in the Township; a proclamation would be sent to DUCOM who is the dispatcher for this area, recognizing their efforts.
- B. Clerk's Report: Clerk Dolan Baumer thanked everyone for their participation at the Annual Town Meeting and specifically thanked Mr. Kuttenberg for his work gathering the material for the annual report. She reminded the Board and staff that the Statements of Economic Interest are due May 1.
- C. Assessor's Report: Assessor Smogolski noted that the tax bills will be going out on time this year and will be due on August 1.

- D. Highway Commissioner's Report. Commissioner Ochoa offered no report.
- E. *Treasurer's Report*: A motion was made by Trustee Benoit and seconded by Trustee Burke to approve the Treasurer's Report subject to final audit, and followed by a roll call vote. Ayes: Trustees Benoit, Burke, Krick and Supervisor McGuire. Nays: none. Motion carried.

#### F. Department Reports:

<u>Departments of</u> Administrative Services, Emergency Services, Community Health, Highway, Facilities & Maintenance, Senior Services, Welfare Services, and the Offices of the Assessor and Clerk offered reports for the Board's review and consideration.

<u>Community Relations Office</u>: Mr. Kuttenberg thanked the Highway Department and Foreman Santangelo for being quick to respond for the need of pothole patching at the Elgin office parking lot.

<u>Youth & Family Services</u>: Director Parquette offered a report for the Board's review and highlighted that the Committee on Youth is preparing to host the annual Principal of the Year on May 15; nominations are now due.
