Facilities and Road Maintenance Department

The Facilities and Road Maintenance Department consists of 7 full time staff and an additional 4 seasonal staff for the summer season. Facilities and Road Maintenance maintains and repairs 8 buildings, 3 reserves, and approximately 13 miles of roadway throughout the Township. This includes internal renovation of spaces, facility maintenance, both repair and preventative, snow removal, and mowing. The department also manages the maintenance, and resurfacing of roadways, culverts and swales, and the Township Brush Pick-Up program, within the unincorporated portions of the township, through both internal and subcontracted work. Facilities and Road Maintenance is also the Township department which issues permits for driveway apron replacement and works closely with the Cook County Code Enforcement Officers to report code violations throughout the Township. Outpatient Family Therapy: Families with at least one child (ages 0-19) are eligible for services. Family therapists assist families to find solutions to difficulties identified in an individual family member or the family as a whole. Referrals for psychiatric evaluation are available when the need is identified. Fees for therapy sessions are charged on a sliding scale basis. Some private insurances are accepted. Outreach and Prevention: Provides services, activities and school programming designed to increase positive alternatives for youth. YFS offers educational workshops on topics of interest to parents and teens attending schools throughout Hanover Township. In addition, our Clinical Interventionist and Prevention Specialists work closely with school district U-46 to provide substance abuse prevention and an Alternate to Suspension Program.

Tutoring Services: Students in grades 2-12, who reside in Hanover Township, are eligible for affordable tutoring on a weekly, one hour basis during the school year. Certified teachers provide small group tutoring and collaborate with the student's referring teacher on a weekly basis.

SHARE provides medically monitored detoxification, residential rehabilitation including a new Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) unit for males, as well as intensive outpatient services and outpatient treatment for Pathological and Problem Gamblers. Renz Center is an outpatient addiction counseling center that provides intensive outpatient, outpatient and early intervention services for adolescents and adults who are faced with consequences and difficulties due to alcohol misuse, other drug use, and/or problem gambling. Specialized women's treatment programming, through the Passage Program, is offered to pregnant women, women with dependent children and other women who have experienced trauma and addiction related issues. Free onsite child care during counseling sessions is provided for our Passage Program clients. Services for those who have a drug and/or

alcohol and a mental health condition or co-occurring disorder is provided including psychiatric services. Renz Center also provides medication assisted treatment utilizing specific medications that help with cravings and obtaining long term abstinence from alcohol and/or opioids. An Opioid Overdose Prevention Program using Naloxone injections, and SMART Recovery, which is an alternative to 12 step meetings, are offered to anyone in the community, even those who are not currently in treatment. Renz Center provides affordable treatment, utilizes a sliding fee scale, accepts Medicaid, Medicare and Managed Medicaid Care Organization coverage, and is in network with various insurance companies. No one is denied services for an inability to pay for services. Renz Center also is a provider of alcohol and drug prevention programs including being the lead agency for the Coalition for a Safe and Healthy Elgin (CSHE), and is the area's primary HIV prevention leader. Finally, Renz Center offers an employee assistance program, Employee Assistance Services, that provides employer consultation on employee issues and behavioral health assessments, short term counseling and referral services to employees of organizations that contract with EAS.
